Ontario Loader Training - Loader Training - Why It Is Essential - Those wanting work in companies that operate lift trucks have to undergo a Loader Training program prior to becoming a certified operator of a lift truck. There are numerous ways to go about acquiring Loader Training. Courses are offered through workforce training agencies, company forklift certification programs, and approved online and video courses. The cost could be minimal (or without charge) when offered through employment agencies or by occupational safety officers on job sites.

Lift truck operators have to be 18 years of age or over, in nearly all countries. Local industry bodies approve Loader Training courses and require operators to obtain a certificate prior to utilizing this type of heavy equipment. A certificate is valid for four years in most areas. Companies that hire staff to drive forklift trucks can face serious liability issues if operators fail to keep this certificate up to date.

Untrained forklift operators can cause serious injuries and property damage because of improper utilization of the equipment. Training consists of the proper loading and driving methods. Employees need to pass a written exam in order to be certified. A company will normally designate a supervisor to be able to provide hands-on training to new employees. A licensed supervisor must have extensive training in forklift safety and be trained as a trainer.
