Ontario Boom Lift Operator Training - The cherry picker work platform is a kind of work platform, that will typically include a bucket or platform at the end of a hydraulic lifting system. The device is likewise called a boom lift, man lift, hydraladder or basket crane.

The platform or bucket is sometimes set onto or mounted to a truck or other vehicle and is occasionally called a bucket truck. Other motor vehicles that can be made use of are stand-alone trailers, self-moving platform or flat back pickup vans. The individual working stands inside the bucket and works from there. The individual in the bucket often comprises an upper set of controls allowing manipulation of the position of the bucket. The reach of the bucket could be extended on some models by telescoping to be able to adjust the lifting arm. Automatic safety controls prevent tipping. Articulated boom lifts are suggested when it is needed to clear obstacles or for working in tight spaces.

Cherry pickers, as the name implies, were initially constructed for picking fruit in trees at high levels. These machines are normally used in various businesses such as exterior painting, construction and mining. Occasionally they are used for cleaning windows on high building. The devices are utilized to service telephone, cable television and electrical equipment on utility poles. Sometimes, firefighters utilize cherry pickers, know as snorkels, when ladders are not enough. At Christmas time, civic workers could be seen inside cherry pickers hanging lights and banners.

Boom Lift Operator Safety Training

Recommended training standards for safety awareness are set by local regulations. Program consists of safe operation methods through a combination of classroom and hands-on components.

The following topics are covered: general equipment safety considerations; current regulations and applicable concerns; features of boom lifts; fall protection, other stationary work platform and scissor lifts.

Likewise included are the different responsibilities of the lift operator, like for instance: function test procedure; workplace inspections; avoiding and knowing dangers; equipment manufacturer's directions and pre-operation inspections procedures.
