Ontario Forklift License - In North America, acquiring a forklift license or forklift certification involves hands-on and classroom training. Regulatory control over licensing, certification and training for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of federal, state and provincial groups. Operators can obtain a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. In any case, regulatory requirements must be met. Recertification is required every two to three years.

The forklift is a powered industrial machine which is designed along with various alternatives, like for example sit-down and stand-up models, electric and propane versions, and different sizes and types to meet the industrial needs of employees. Operator training courses are normally individualized to address the particular uses and types for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered forklift in a warehouse surroundings will not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered lift truck in a shipyard. The various lift trucks and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all equipment and businesses. Regulatory standards, hence, have a tendency not to concentrate on particular program requirements but instead on the outcome of individual training courses.

On the job training that is provided by the employer is the most common method of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who provides this method of certification is required to provide classroom sessions and practical training on machinery at their place of work. Employers may opt to train staff on each and every type of forklift separately, or to train them on all machines combined. The course incorporates forklift operation methods, safety measures, company regulations and forklift maintenance. Topics specific to the worksite, such as hazardous materials or conditions, should be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely use and operate each and every kind of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor normally needs an on-site component with hands-on practice.

Typically, a certification provided by an employer will not transfer from the current employer to the next employer. Receiving a lift truck license through employer-provided training permits the operator to operate a forklift for that particular employer only.

Forklift safety will always be an essential aspect of the lift truck license training, although the particulars of the safety training would be dependent upon the equipment being used. Several safety problems will vary for each industry and employer. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers might have to address extra requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like for example in offshore and marine operations.
